London House Publishing will introduce the first three-dimensional novel at the 2nd Annual Ohioana Book Festival, May 10th from 10:00 a.m. to 4:30 p.m at the State Library of Ohio, 274 E 1st Ave. in Columbus, Ohio. This unique historical novel, *Dearest* by Michelangelo Altière, published in the fall of 2007, is being showcased for the first time in Columbus at the Ohioana Book Festival. *Dearest* is the first of its kind and a copy will be included in the collection of the Ohioana Library.

In 1872 a small town Marietta milliner and a wealthy engineer from Pittsburgh have a chance encounter on a small Ohio riverboat bound from Cincinnati. From that moment on their lives are changed. Only the change is not what they expect. They are two ordinary people caught up in a powerful relationship and life-altering circumstances. *Dearest* is their extraordinary story.

And just as extraordinary is the presentation. The reader's sense of smell, touch, and sight is engaged with each letter of the correspondence and the keepsakes that are part of their story. *Dearest* is as much art as it is literature. Carefully handmade in America, it is available in three different editions.

Unlike anything created in the literary world, *Dearest* is the first of a number of "Experience Novels" to be produced in the coming years by London House Publishing. *Dearest* will be available for purchase at the Ohioana Book Festival.
